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A Means of Expressing Loyalty

Alumni and Other Friends are Requested to

Make Good Students at Wake Forest

Every friend of Wake Forest College would likely approve the statement that the student body of the College should be superior in every respect. The Wake Forest tradition is that a member of its family should be a gentleman as well as a scholar. The community should be cosmopolitan in gifts and diversity of interests, and, at the same time, be a safe place for a young man to live.

It has been suggested that the College should have an enrollment of about one thousand. This number would, without sacrificing personality to the "crowd," largely prevent the existence of a provincial spirit, furnish ample talent for many commendable college activities such as athletic teams, a band, the glee club, an orchestra, debating, etc., relatively reduce the cost of overhead in administration and instruction, and provide training for a reasonably large number of leaders within the ranks of North Carolina Baptists who now number about four hundred thousand.

Wake Forest would not be exclusive. The College would welcome any worthy student who can meet requirements for admission. The College exists to serve. It is obvious, however, that Wake Forest wishes students of the finest character and greatest academic promise. The College is not a reformatory. The College desires those who possess, along with attributes of character and scholarship, special ability as debaters, musicians, and athletes.
