

SAMUEL DUTY

....In 1824, Rev. Thomas D. Mason, a teacher of vocal music and a licentiate of Brier Creek Church, Chatham county, N. C., having located in the vicinity and united with the church, was called to the pastorate and ordained to the ministry. He served the church in that capacity until 1827, when Elder Samuel Duty became their pastor and served the church for one year.

HISTORY OF GRASSY CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH by R. I. Devin, p. 91

.....Poplar Creek Church in Granville county was constituted by Elders Josiah Crudup and Samuel Duty the 24th September 1836.

FLAT RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION MINUTES, 1845, p. 10

.....In the history of Hesters church in last year's minutes it is stated that this church was planted by Rev. William B. Worrell, &c. I learn this is a mistake, that, though bro. Worrell preached the first sermon in the House, the church was planted by Rev. Samuel Duty, and bro. Duty was their first pastor. T.B.B.
