"For reasons of health," said Kears, "the Boones were forced to return to America. Unable to remain idle, they followed God's leadership in seeking to establish Bible-preaching churches in rural Texas, where few such churches exist today."

During the "Missions Emphasis," the Boones will be sharing their missionary experiences and details of their lives among the tribal people with those attending the services. Films and an informal discussion session will be on the program.

The public is encouraged to attend the services and meet the Sang Boones.

Crestview Plans 'Peace Child' Film For Sunday Evening

"Peace Child," a masterful film of primitive life in the jungles of Irian Jaya, will be shown Sunday at 7:30 p.m. at Crestview Baptist Church, announces the pastor, the Rev. William S. Kearse. The church is situated on U.S. highway 220 north of Rockingham.

Filmed in the unspoiled jungles of what was formerly Dutch New Guinea, "Peace Child" documents the startling reaction of stone-age people to the message of the Gospel of Christ.

Missionaries Don and Carol Richardson respond to the call of God to work among these people. After careful preparation and a 10,000-mile journey, they find themselves in the shadows and sunlight of a rain forest inhabited by primitive head hunters. Painstakingly they learn the language but are shocked when their account of Judas' betrayal of Jesus makes him a hero to people whose highest attribute is to be masters of treachery.

An inter-tribal war continues until a warring chief offers his son as the means of bringing a lasting peace. The war ends and a primitive tribal custom makes the Gospel understandable.

Dr. Warren Wiersbe, senior minister of the world famous Moody Memorial Church in Chicago, after previewing "Peace Child" said, "This has to be the finest missionary film I have seen in the last ten years."
