

Bethlehem Baptist To Install Pastor

The Rev. Kenneth Lambert will be installed as pastor of Bethlehem Baptist Church during the 11 a.m. worship service Sunday. Leading the service will be the Rev. F. D. Hemphill, who has served the church as interim pastor since October, 1973.

The Rev. Mr. Lambert, a native of Valdese, is a graduate of Wingate Junior College, Lenoir Rhyne College, Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary and the Pastoral Care School at Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem.

In addition to serving several Unifour area church as interim pastor, the Rev. Mr. Lambert has been pastor of churches in Polkville and in Sandy Hook, Va.

The Lambert family, including the Rev. Mr. Lasmbert, his wife, Helen, and their two children, Tonya and Todd, have moved into the church parsonage.

A reception for the Lamberts in the church fellowship hall will follow a 7 p.m. service Sunday including music by the church choirs and the Bible school commencement.

In a service last Sunday, the congregation burned a note of

debt on church property. The note, which dated from 1957, was originally for \$67,000. Participating in the ceremony were the Rev. Mr. Hemphill and trustees Claude Bowman and Tommy E. Hefner. The Rev. Woodrow Hill, associate editor of the Biblical Record, was guest preacher.
