

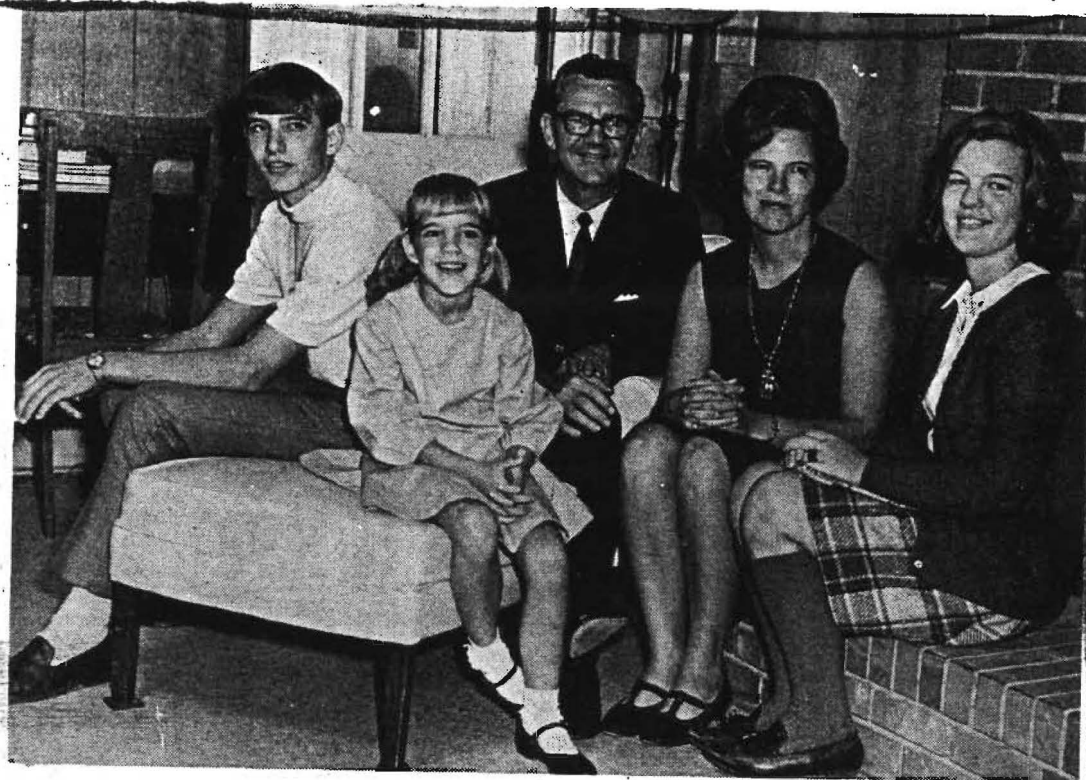

With the whole family in school, Mrs. Beal, a Campbell

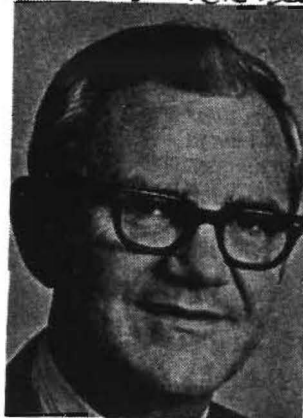

R. Lewis Beal was born June 7, 1926 at Lincolnton, N.C. He was ordained to the Gospel Ministry April 15, 1951 by the Lincoln Avenue Baptist Church, Lincolnton, N.C.

He received his education at Lincolnton High School; Lees McRae College; Wake Forest University, AB 1951; Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, BD 1955 converting to M Div. 1970.

On August 22, 1948 he was married to Jean Simpson of Charlotte, N.C. In addition to Jean he is survived by a son Christopher, a law student at Campbell University; Mrs. Cynthia Jean Richardson whose husband Ronald is pastor of Mt. Zion Baptist Church, Alexis, N.C. and Laura Lynn 17 of the home.

Lewis served as pastor of the following churches: Vass Baptist Church, Vass, N.C. 1951-55; Fairgrove Baptist Church, Hickory, N.C. 1955-57; Angier Baptist Church Angier, N.C. May 1957-November 2, 1973.

Following these pastorates Lewis served as Financial Aid Director, Campbell College November 1973 until his passing August 31, 1979.

As a denominational servant he served as President, Little River Associational Pastors' Conference 1960; Chairman, Campbell college Appreciation Day Planning Committee for Little River Association 1965-67; Campbell College Committee of Ministers 1969-73; Moderator, Little River Association 1963-65; Member of General Board of N.C. Baptist State Convention 3 years; Member of council on Christian Higher Education 1971-73; Cooperative Program Consultant, Region 4, 1971-73; Member of Committee on Boards SBC 1973.

Active in civic affairs he was president and treasurer of the Kiwanians and selected as Kiwanian of the Year, Angier Club, 1970.

Lewis was a Christian gentleman, humble, gracious, helpful, compassionate. His life and ministry was a blessing to all who knew him. Our loss is Heaven's gain.
