

JEPHTHA CLARK

1836 - At the request of Macedonia a presbytery was appointed to examine and ordain Jeptha Clark. Jeptha Clark was an active minister for more than forty years. He died 1872. His education was very limited and his gifts meagre. He was a poor preacher. His character was above reproach; all had confidence in his integrity. To the best of his ability he served the Master. He preached at Macedonia, Mt. Ruhama, Thessalonica, Lebanon, Olivet, New Bethany, and in fact, at almost every church in eastern Lincoln and Catawba in his day.
