

Landrus resigning at First Baptist

Edward Landrus has resigned as minister of education at the First Baptist Church in Morganton to accept a position at Providence Baptist Church in Charlotte.

At Providence, he will be minister with children from infancy through sixth grade.

His resignation at the First Baptist will become effective Aug. 31 and he will assume his new duties Sept. 1.

A native of Illinois, Landrus, is a graduate of Shurtleff College at Alton, Ill., and Southeastern Seminary at Wake Forest. He served as minister of education at the First Baptist Church in Hopewell, Va., before coming to the Morganton church nine

years ago.

He is a member of the Morgnton Rotary Club and has served as Heart Fund chairman. His wife, Carolyn, has been a second-grade teacher at Drexel School. They have three daughters: Rhoda, a junior at Appalachian State University; Kathryn, a rising 10th grader; and Margaret, a rising seventh grader.

Providence church has five ministers, with the Rev. Henry Crouch the senior minister. Mr. Crouch is the son of Dr. Perry Crouch, who retired several months ago as general secretary-treasurer of the N.C. Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. Dr. Crouch at one time was pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Morganton.
