Automobile Wreck

Rev. James Garrell Holloway, 38 of Route 1, Andrews, died Monday unexpectedly in South Carolina as a result of an automobile accident.

He was a native of Topton and life long resident of Cherokee County. He was the son of Connie Holloway Evans Holloway and the late J.G. Holloway. He received his G.E.D. Degree from the United Armed Forces Institute in Japan and received his diploma in Brick, Block and Carpentry from Tri-County Tech. in Murphy. He was a member and Pastor of the McCelland Cove Baptist Church for the past two years and had been reelected for another year last Sunday. He was licensed to preach on December 22, 1974 and ordained on November 8, 1975.

Surviving are the wife, Mrs. Wanda Hooper Holloway; two sons, James G. Holloway Jr. and Darrel Arnold Holloway both of the home; four sisters, Linda Holloway, Mrs. Betty Ledford, Mrs. Sally Palmer and Mrs. Ethel Woods all of Topton, six brothers, J.C., Jack and Sam Holloway of Summerset,
