Durham Pastor Gets State Baptist Position

A Durham pastor was elected president of the General Board of the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina during the session held this week in Asheville.

James I. Murphy, pastor of Hope Valley Baptist Church, was elected unanimously. He served as vice president of the board during 1983.

A North Carolina native, Murphy has a doctorate from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. He was on the staff of Campbell University before becoming pastor of

Hope Valley.

In his new post, Murphy will lead the 114-member board, which directs the affairs of the state's largest religious body between annual sessions. The board is responsible for the preparation of the denomination's annual budget, which is \$24,478,000 for 1984, and for the supervision of the 140-member staff of the Baptist Building in Cary.

The board also relates to the 12 agencies and institutions owned by the convention, including seven colleges, homes for

children and the aged, N.C. Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem, the Baptist Foundation and the *Biblical Recorder*.
