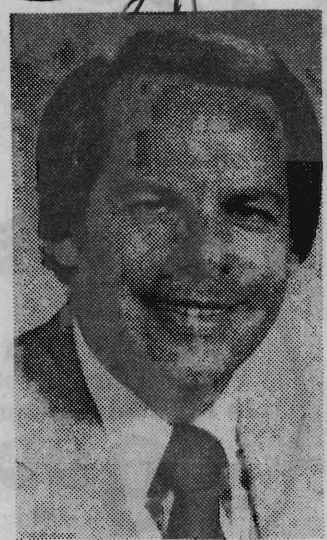

Pastor to resign

Dr. Charles H. Harris, pastor of First Baptist Church in Durham, will resign effective July 31 to become director of the Caraway Conference Center of the N.C. Baptist Convention.

The Caraway Center in Asheville is used primarily as a retreat by North Carolina Baptists.

Harris completed 10 years as pastor of First Baptist in March. The congregation gave him a cash gift and three-month sabbatical, to run from June 1 to Aug. 31.

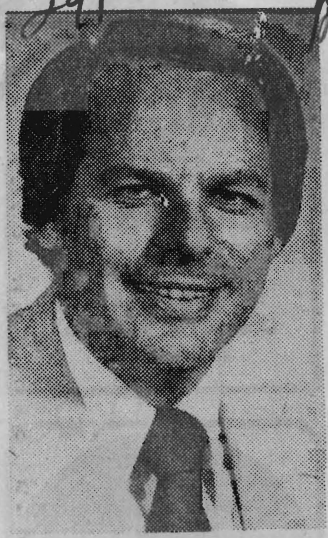
Dr. Leland Williams, chairman of the board of deacons at the church, said the sabbatical will not be affected by Harris' resignation.

Pastor Resigns At First Baptist To Take New

Dr. Charles H. Harris, pastor of First Baptist Church in Durham since March 26, 1978, announced his resignation during the worship service Sunday.

He will become director of the Caraway Conference Center of the North Carolina Baptist Convention on Aug. 1.

The resignation, which was received by the church with regrets, will be effective July 31.

On March 27, First Baptist honored Dr. and Mrs. Harris on the occasion of their 10th anniversary at the church. The congregation gave him a cash love gift and a three-month sabbatical, to begin June 1 and run through Aug. 31.

Dr. Leland Williams, chairman of the board of deacons, said the sabbatical will not be affected by the resignation. He said the church wants Dr. and Mrs. Harris to enjoy the sabbatical as a
