

Pastoral Counseling Service

To Begin Here

The Rev. Herman Nodine, an ordained Baptist minister, is heading a Pastoral Counseling Service in Shelby.

Nodine said his new office, which will be located in room six of the Gardner Building on Warren Street, will offer fulltime personal, social, and spiritual guidance; and has the support of several churches in Cleveland County. Nodine further announced that he will work in cooperation with the Mental Health Clinic and other welfare agencies. "This will also be a ministry of referral," said Nodine. "If I can't help a person with his problem, I'll refer him to someone who can."

The ministry counseling will be a community service, and open to anyone of all ages.

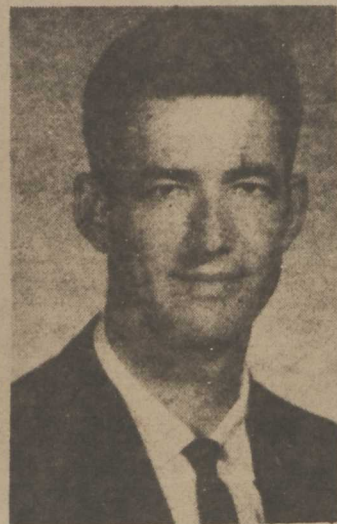
Rev. Nodine has been in the Baptist ministry for the past ten years. He is a native of

Spartanburg County, South Carolina. After 5 and one-half years in the military service, he received his BA from Carson-Newman College, and Bachelor of Divinity from Southeastern Seminary at Wake Forest, N. C. He did further studies at the Dorothea Dix Mental Hospital in Raleigh. While in seminary training, Nodine served as Chaplain for the Raleigh Rescue Mission.

He is married and has two children: Billy, a student at Shelby High School; and Melinda, a freshman at Gardner-Webb College.

Rev. Nodine who moved to Shelby this summer from Gaffney, summed up his new service as follows: "I feel the greatest ministry a person can render is to establish a good relationship between man and man."
