The Rev. Howard is married

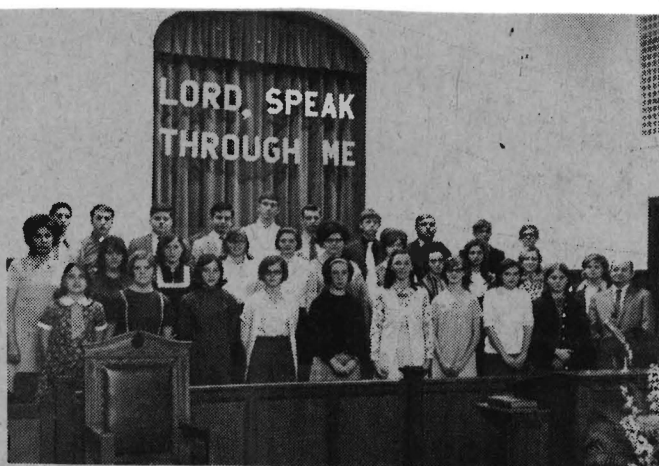

Rowan Baptist Churches To Observe "M" Night

The 36 churches of the Rowan Baptist Association will observe their annual "M" (Mobilization) night Monday, beginning at 7 p.m. in the Landis Baptist Church.

Guest speaker for the event will be the Rev. Stanley K. Howard, pastor of the Alexis Baptist Church.

A graduate of Wake Forest College and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, the Rev. Mr. Howard has been pastor of the Alexis Church for six years. He will use chalk talks and Happy Danny (a dummy) to emphasize the 1970 "M" Night theme, "Train to Make a Difference," in the churches of the Rowan Association. Rev. Howard has had much success in the use of chalk talks and using the dummy in getting across the Christian message to both youth and adults across the years.
