REPORT ON OBITUARIES

Elder J. C. Wilson, of blessed memory, was born in Chatham County, N. C.,-----, and died on his way home from Shady Grove Church, -----, 1894. For many years he was pastor of Shady Grove, Olive's Chapel, Holly Spring, Salem, Cedar Fork, Cane Creek, Merry Oaks, Mt. Pisgah, Lystra, and other churches in the Raleigh and Mount Zion Associations. His preaching was of a high and sound order, very instructive and Biblical. He did not preach with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power. Bro. Wilson fed the flock of God which he had purchased with his own precious blood, over which the Holy Ghost had made him overseer. He was a great lover of our denomination, and rejoiced in all its great Christian enterprises. His mind was well stored with useful information, and he kept abreast with the progress of the age. Working at all times in harmony with the Convention, he was full of the spirit of Missions. Thus, with mind enriched by extensive reading, his heart full of love to God and man, he was eminently prepared to be a wise and safe leader, as well as counselor and friend.

For years he was the Moderator of this Association. All his rulings were marked with dignity and gave satisfaction because of their fairness. In the ministry, his long years of consecrated toil were blessed of God to the salvation of many souls.

The latter years of our brother's life were attended with many afflictions, but he bore up under them all with that meekness and patience which becomes the servant of our Lord Jesus Christ. If any man could say aught of him, it was more than we ever heard. Truly, of him can it be said, "Well done, good and faithful servant". He could say, in view of his earthly career and in the expectation of the joy ahead of him, "I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand; I have fought a good fight; I have finished my course; I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteous-

ness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, shall give me in that day."

WILSON, REV. J. C., was born in Chatham Co., N. C., July 23, 1820; baptized by Rev. P. W. Doud (Dowd) in 1838; ordained in November, 1849, Revs. P. W. Doud and J. Olin (Olive) forming the Presbytery; was educated at Wake Forest College, and has served with great acceptance a number of churches in Orange, Chatham, and Wake Counties. Mr. Wilson has been for many years the moderator of the Mount Zion Association.
