RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE CHURCH IN CONFERENCE MAY, 7 1939;

The board of Deacons and the graveyard committee, having studied the situation, and having come to realize the necessity of making some constructive suggestions to the Church with reference to a more business like procedure in the management of the church cemetery, so that later years the members of the Church may be assured of a place of burial, and so that in a few more years the Church itself may not have to go to large expense to provide more burial space for its own members and their immediate families, therefore presents the following recommendations for the disposal of the Church in Conference.

1st. That henceforth, until duly ordered otherwise by the Church in Conference, only those people who are at the present time, or in the future shall become members of the Church and their immediate families, living in the Church community shall be buried in the Church cemetery free of charge or expense for a grave site.

2nd That henceforth or until, duly ordered otherwise by the Church in conference, only those who are members living out of the community, of the immediate families of Church members, may be buried in the Church cemetery, (Immediate families meaning Father, Mother, Sons and daughters those they marry and children). and furthermore that these living out of the community, but being members of the immediate families of Church members, may be buried in the Cemetery only upon proper arrangements with the graveyard committee for the payment of a just and suitable fee, to be determined by the Church in conference.

3rd That the fee for the grave site be the sum of twenty five (\$25.00), to be paid to the chairman of the graveyard committee, he to turn this money in the cemetery fund, to over to the local Church treasurer, and the local treasurer to deposite this money in a cemetery fund, to be used at the discretion of the Church and the graveyard committee for the care of the cemetery, and if need be, for the purchase of future grave sites; the Church treasurer to keep the Church informed from time to time of the amount of money in the Church cemetery fund.

(A) That in connection with this fee of \$25.00 the graveyard committee be privileged to deduct \$5.00 only on conditions that the family of the bereaved dig the grave or have it dug.

4th That if at any time, in the Christian judgement of the graveyard committee there shall arise a situation in which the family of the one to be buried could not produce the necessary fee, (being too poor to do so) then the committee is authorized by the Church to find a suitable place in the cemetery for the burial of said person, so that it may never be said of the Church of Christ that it has willfully denied to any one too poor to pay the fee, the privilege of Christian burial.

Futhermore, the Deacons and graveyard committee would impress upon this Church assembled in conference that in making these recommendations it has done so with the unselfish Christian purpose of helping the Church and with no thought of hurting the feelings of anyone, who, in the future might be concerned, and with no intention of commercialization.
