

BRO. WILLIAM F. BRASINGTON "finished his course" at his home, in Lancaster County, August 23d, 1883, in the 76th year of his age.

He was born in Sumter County, S. C.; lived awhile in Camden, where, as the son of a widow, he was forced to hard labor, and was remarkable for his faithfulness and honesty. Upon his conversion, he was received into the membership of the Camden Baptist Church, and soon feeling that God had called him to preach, he threw aside his occupation, and heartily entered into the work. For a few years he toiled as Missionary, and during his long ministry he preached at different times in both of the Carolinas. He was an earnest student of the Scriptures and of human nature,--a man of sound judgement, good memory, strong will, courage, endurance, conscientious and pious, and withal very useful. Several churches in the Moriah Association were built up through his instrumentality. Full of the Holy Spirit, and of faith, his last words were, "All is peace!"
