He is married to Bobbie Jean Ingram, and they have three children: Gwyn, age 12; Wendy Jo, age 11; and Kevin age 8.

Mansfield To Leave Southside

The Rev. Jack Mansfield, pastor of Mooreville's Southside Baptist Church for the past five years, has resigned, effective Aug. 11.

Mansfield, 53, is going to Georgia, where he will work toward establishing a church, he told his congregation Sunday following morning worship.

He will be working with the Middle Cherokee Baptist Association and the George Baptist Convention in helping them begin a Southern Baptist Church in the Cartersville-Acworth area.

This section, called Red Top Mountain-Altoona, is where large numbers of people have relocated after having migrated from the Atlanta area.

Mansfield said his wife will teach at Cassville Middle School in Bartow County.

In announcing his resignation at Southside, Mansfield's comments included: "Missions have always had a special place in my heart and this opportunity to help begin a new work is where I find my interest and

concern to be the greatest at the present time. Though the work is hard and often challenging, there is no greater sense of accomplishment than being in on the beginning of a new witness for our Lord, knowing through the years what that new work can do.

Mansfield and his wife are parents of three children, two of whom are married. The third child still is in school.

Southside has grown dramatically during Mansfield's pastorage. It now has a membership of 1,113.

Mansfield was instrumental in Southside establishing a mission on Lake Norman that has grown rapidly and now is constituted as Peninsula Baptist Church.
