

Lovedale Church Revival Begins On November 5

Revival services will begin November 5 at Lovedale Baptist Church. The Rev. C. H. Greene will be the evangelist. Services will start at 7:30 each night.

Rev. Greene Resigns From Lincoln Ave.

The resignation of Rev. C. H. Greene, pastor of Lincoln Avenue Baptist Church for the past eight years, has been announced by the church officers.

Rev. Greene has served his church commission and association well, and under his leadership many accomplishments have been made. Sunday School attendance has increased as much as 200, with graded material, with 14 departments. Other active phases include Training Union Brotherhood

W.M.U., G.A.'s R.A.'s Y.W.A.,
and Sunbeams.

A new Educational Building has been built, and gifts to the Cooperative program have increased \$2,600.00 annually. The total gift to the church has increased more than \$26,000 a year.

Rev. Greene has served as moderator of the South Fork Association for two years, also as Sunday School Superintendent of the Association, and was on the executive board of the association. He has served four years on the General Board of the State Convention.

Rev. Greene, who has accepted a pastorage in Hendersonville, has made many achievements during his stay in Lincolnnton. He and Mrs. Greene have been very faithful Christian workers.

Wednesday night, during "Family Night Get-Together", the congregation of Lincoln Avenue Church presented the Greenes with a silver tea service.

The year 1912 marked the birth of C.H. Greene, who was destined to a long useful life in dedicated service to his Saviour. He was ordained in the Calvary Baptist Church in Canton, North Carolina. For 44 years he faithfully served churches in Haywood, Buncombe, Madison, Lincoln, Henderson and Jackson Counties. Each church he served prepared him for the next. After 44 years of dedicated service he retired from the Scotts Creek Baptist Church but continued to serve as interim pastor in other churches until his death in 1984.

He served with the Home Mission Board for 9 years during which time he organized 17 churches in the State of Washington. Wherever he served, C.H. Greene was original, bold and brilliant in his work.

He was truly God's servant. He was strongly dedicated to his work, kind, but determined and courageous. He was not afraid to venture into the unknown for he had a strong faith that the work he was doing was God called. The Holy Spirit endowed him with the gift of prophecy and he utilized that gift to the very best of his ability. He was an apostle in the sense that he was sent with a message to those who were unsaved. The saved he taught with patience, promoting their spiritual growth, thus enabling them to live a full life in God's will.

The Reverend Greene married Mabel Sutton. Their home was blessed with a son, Charles Greene of Gastonia, a daughter, Claudia Smith of Tampa, Florida, and three grandchildren. While C.H. has now gone beyond the "Hills of Time into the Sunset glow" he will be waiting there in God's eternal love while his friends go to meet him.

G. Leland Royster was born in Cleveland County, February 11, 1912 to Henry Cleveland Royster and Cleo Spangler Royster. He was married to Bernice Greene, Spartanburg, SC in 1932 who died in 1969. He later married Margaret Brineger of Coolee, NC. Bernice and Leland had one daughter, Rebecca Ann and two grandsons.

He served in the following churches in North Carolina:

He was a graduate of Gardner-Webb College, Furman University, and Southern Baptist Seminary.

He served on various boards of the Baptist State Convention, worked with many civic groups, and after retirement served as interim and supply pastor for a number of the churches in Buncombe Baptist Association.

He was called home to be with the Lord on November 22, 1983.

C. H. Greene was born in Jackson County, January 27, 1912 to Claude and Lena Greene. He married Mabel Sutton and they had one son Charles H. and one daughter, Claudia, and three grandchildren. He was converted at age 16 in Locust Field Baptist Church in Dillsboro, N.C.

C. H. was a graduate of Sylva High School, Western North Carolina College, Fruitland Baptist Bible Institute and Mars Hill College. He did graduate work at New Orleans Baptist Seminary.

He was ordained by Calvary Baptist Church, Canton, NC in the early 1940's.

He was a Baptist minister for 44 years before retiring in 1979 from Scotts Creek Baptist Church in Sylva. Rev. Greene pastored several churches in Haywood, Buncombe, Madison, Lincoln, and Henderson Counties.

Greene served on the Southern Baptist Convention Home Mission Board in Washington nine years during which time he organized seventeen new churches.

He was active in the Southern Baptist Convention and had served on various boards of the North Carolina, Washington and Oregon Baptist State Conventions.

The Lord called him home on April 17, 1984.
