Logan to lead black Baptists in North Carolina

Welfare reform poses challenge

The General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, the umbrella organization of the state's 1,300 black Missionary Baptist churches, has a new chief executive.

The Rev. Archie Doyster Logan Jr., pastor of Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church in Kittrell and adjunct professor of theology at Shaw Divinity School in Raleigh, was unanimously chosen by the 30-member executive committee earlier this week.

Logan, whose job title is executive secretary-treasurer, will give spiritual direction to the 500,000-member organization and be responsible for all administrative affairs. The convention has a budget of \$5.2 million this year.

He replaces C.C. Craig, who retired last year.

Logan said one of his top priorities is to prepare for changes in the nation's welfare reform law.

"We want to reach out to people on the verge of losing benefits so they can move from welfare to work," Logan said.

The Baptist convention wants to encourage churches to open training centers that prepare people for technological changes in the workplace. Logan said he envisions churches forming partnerships to make better use of existing resources.

The convention is very concerned that the state is spending too much money on building prisons rather than educating the disadvantaged, he said.

The group has ambitious plans to convert the J.J. Johnson Baptist Assembly, a 50-acre wooded retreat in Laurel Hill, into a state-of-the-art convention center.

The General Baptist State Convention is celebrating its 130th anniversary this year. It was founded in 1867 by former slaves who gathered at the First African Baptist Church in Goldsboro.

Logan, 48, is a native of Reidsville. He received an undergraduate degree from Wake Forest University, a master's from Duke University Divinity School and a doctorate in education from N.C. State University.

Making his mark ...

The Rev. Dr. Archie Logan Jr. has worked his way up through the ranks

The Rev. Dr. Archie Doyster Logan Jr. said, "I did all the regular Reidsville things."

But one look at his credentials will prove to anyone he is far from "regular."

Logan was elected Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, Inc. (GBSC) on March 3, 1997.

A native of Reidsville, he is the son of the late Dr. Archie D. Logan Sr. and Eneshel Margaret Logan.

He began working for GBSC in 1979 and served as Assistant to the Executive Secretary-Treasurer until the retirement of Dr. C. C. Craig in August 1996.

Founded in 1867 by a band of freedmen and former slaves at the First African Baptist Church in Goldsboro, GBSC is the largest African-American religious denomination in the state and represents more than 500,000 members and 1,800 churches throughout N.C.

Logan remembered his 1967 graduation ceremony in Tiger Stadium, "Now there's a piece of history," noting he was the first African-American to graduate from Reidsville Senior High School. He received a B.A. in Communications from Wake For-

est University and was a player on the 1970 ACC Championship Football Team.

Logan continued his education, receiving a Master of Divinity in 1975 and Master of Theology in 1976 from Duke University Divinity School. In 1994, he received his doctorate from North Carolina State University.

Logan appears to stay busy. In addition to his duties with GBSC, he is an adjunct instructor at Shaw Divinity School, a member of the trustee board and faculty of the Apex Academy and School of Religion and is pastor of the Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church in Kittrell.

He also serves on the board of advisors at Wake Forest University Divinity School, is a member of the Home Mission Board of the Progressive National Baptist Convention, Inc. and editor of the Baptist Progress. He is a recognized scholar on the African-American Religious Experience and Adult Education.

Logan is a member of Lone Star Lodge, Reidsville Consistory and Khalif Temple and is a life member of the NAACP.

Logan married Margaret Elaine Evans and has three children. They have lived in Raleigh for 20 years but his memories of Reidsville still are very vivid.

"I played sports for Reidsville with Corey Isaacs. Sonny Bassinger was track coach," Logan continued, "Jack Ballinger...Jerry Apple...I remember everyone from my class. I had a great time. David Stadler and I ran track together. Larry Hill played basketball."

Dr. Freeman Jones, a member of First Baptist Church, watched Logan grow from a small child. "We always felt he was as much ours as the Logans" Logan was raised in the church where his father was minister. Noting Logan was active in the church, Jones said, "He had to be." and laughed.

Logan was "an only child and his mom and dad was determined he was not going to be spoiled"

said Jones. An Eagle Scout, Logan remembers Troop #70. "Mr. Pennix was the scout master," he said.

Jones still talks with Logan on occasion.

"He was instrumental in helping the church search for a minister and he comes back to our church to speak," said Jones, "He is always gracious about doing that."

"We are very proud of him because he has accomplished a great deal."
