

Attack Fatal To Rev. Mason Of Mocksville

Rev. Baxter Sherman Mason, 51, of R. 3, Mocksville, died early Sunday afternoon at Davie County Hospital. He had suffered a heart attack after preaching at the morning service at Boxwood Baptist Church where he was pastor. He was also pastor of Old Smith Grove View Baptist Church in Lexington.

Rev. Mason was born in Davie County to Rev. Dennis D. and Lizzie Winford Mason. He was employed at the Henry Link home in Lexington and was a veteran of World War II. He was a former member of Cedar Grove Baptist Church.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Edna Ijames Mason, of the home; a son, William S.
