The Rev. Harry A. Goble, a Baptist missionary on medical furlough from Guam, will speak in the 11 o'clock worship service at Mount Zion Baptist Church in the Mulberry Community on April 23, according to an announcement by the Rev. Fred Joines, pastor. Everybody is invited.

Mr. Goble is a native of Gastonia, veteran of World War I and a graduate of Gardner-Webb College. He received his bachelor's degree at Carson Newman College and B. D. Degree from the New Orleans Baptist Seminary in 1954. He also had clinical training in the Department of Pastoral Care at N. C. Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem.

Navy Veteran Church Speaker

Rev. Harry A. Goble will speak at the 11 a.m. service Sunday at New Hope Baptist church four miles north of Bolton, it was announced today.

Rev. Goble is a native of Gastonia and served with the Navy 1942-46 in World War II. Following military duty, he graduated from Gardner-Webb College at Boiling Springs, then enrolled at Carson-Newman College in Tennessee where he received a B.S. degree in 1951.

He entered New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary later in 1951 and received the B.D. degree there in 1954. In addition he has three months of clinical training at the N. C. Baptist Hospital at Winston Salem.

Rev. Goble has held pastorates at Morganton, Clinton, Tenn. and at Winston Salem. In 1960 he was appointed to the foreign mission field for four years of service on the Island of Guam where he was instrumental in establishing three Baptist churches.

Mrs. Goble is the former Doris Anne Cash of Winston Salem and they have two sons, Kent and Todd.
