JOHN T. PULLEN

.The best loved man in the city of Raleigh went to his reward when early in the morning of May 2d, Brother John T. Pullen died at the age of sixty years, and after a life full of good deeds. Ill for many months, he kept at his daily task with heroic spirit until he fell on the field of battle. He filled a large place in the life of our Capital City, and of our denomination, being trustee and treasurer of Meredith College, member of our State Mission Board, and builder of the Fayetteville Street (now Pullen Memorial) Church. He was a successful banker and man of affairs, whose voice was influential in any company of our citizens, but whose chief distinction and that which gave him access to every heart was his intense but unassuming piety, which expressed itself in a loving personal philanthropy almost without parallel. Not a day passed without its train of little nameless, unrecorded acts of love. Long will the memory of him be sweet in the city where he lived and loved.

Pullen, John T "L" and "B". Born in 1853, he was in the Banking business in Raleigh, a business in which quite successful. He, however, came to be "the best loved man in Raleigh" because he possessed an unassuming piety which expressed itself in a loving personal philanthropy almost without parallel; and these acts were unrecruited acts of love. He, therefore, filled a large place in the Capital City and in the Baptist denomination. He was a member of the State Board of Missions, a Trustee of Meredith, and for a time also Treasurer. He was the builder of the Fayetteville Street Baptist Church, now Calvary Church, since 1935. The present Pullen Memorial Church ~~was established~~, located 1801 Hillsboro St. was established in 1923.

During his last years, and particularly during his last year he was far from being a well man. His death came in 1913 when he was only 60 years of age. Truly, he was one of God's Noblemen.
