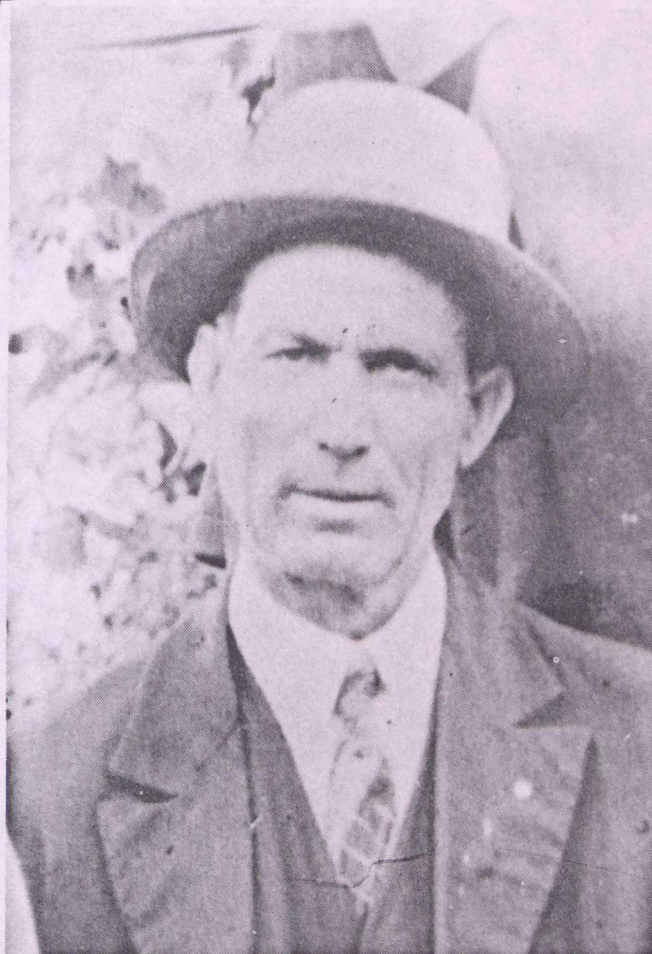




ALVIN S. SOLESBEE

1918-1920 and 1924-1926

Alvin Solesbee was born at Long Branch near Kyle, North Carolina in June 1875 and died in 1937. He was married to Bell Kilpatrick and they had five children: Spurgeon and Paul Solesbee and Hope Patton of Franklin, N.C., Kate Phillips of Tennessee and Ruby S. Reid who is deceased.

Mr. Solesbee pastored churches throughout Macon County which were: Tellico, Burningtown, Holly Springs, Oak Grove, and Watauga. He taught school in his home community near where the present day Nantahala School is located.
