

The Rev. Haven Clifford Lowe, former pastor of the Immanuel Baptist Church of Knoxville, Tenn., has recently moved to Whitwell. The Rev. Mr. Lowe has accepted a call from the Whitwell Baptist Church. He began his ministry at the church June 30.

The Rev. Mr. Lowe is a native of Bristol, Tenn., where he received his high school and elementary education. He is also a graduate of Carson-Newman College (B.A.), Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary (B.D.). He has done additional study at East Tennessee State University, and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Past denominational duties include moderator of Holston Baptist Association, Tennessee; president and vice-president of Knoxville Baptist Pastor's Conference; vice-president of East Tennessee Preacher's Conference; pastor advisor of Tennessee Baptist Brotherhood.

He has preached in simultaneous revivals, worked with Home Mission Board, and assisted in Cherokee Indian work on the Reservation at Cherokee. Also he has served as a member of committee on boards, Tennessee Baptist Convention, trustee of Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes, and evangelism committee and chairman of stewardship committee of Knoxville County Association of Baptists.

The Rev. Mr. Lowe was married to Etta Jane Hodge of Shouns, Tenn. Mrs. Lowe received a Certificate in Theology from the Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. 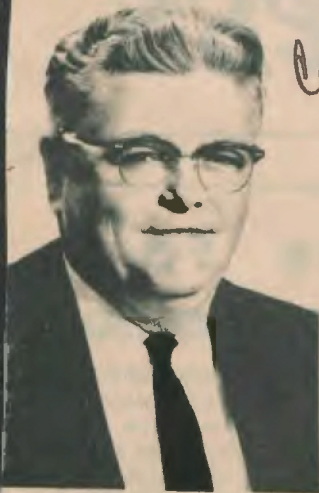

Rev. Haven Clifford Lowe, 83, of
403 Twin Oaks Dr., died Thurs-
day, Nov. 11, 1999, in Johnson City
Medical Center.

The funeral for Rev. Lowe will
be conducted at 11 a.m. Monday,
Nov. 15, 1999, at Pinecrest Baptist
Church, Johnson City, Tenn. Buri-
al will follow in Glenwood Ceme-
tery, Bristol, Tenn.

He was a native of Bristol,
Tenn. and a son of the late Clifford
Henry and Katie Blackwell Lowe.
He was a graduate of Tennessee
High School, Bristol. He received
his bachelor of arts degree from
Carson-Newman College, Jeffer-
son City, Tenn. and his master of
divinity degree from Southeastern
Baptist Theological Seminary,
Wake Forest. He had also done
additional studies at East Tennes-
see State University, Southern
Baptist Theological Seminary,
Louisville, Ky. and Western Caro-
lina University Extension Center,
Cherokee. He became an or-
dained Southern Baptist minister
in 1937. Rev. Lowe pastored 15
churches in Tennessee, North
Carolina, and Virginia, before his
retirement in 1983. He also served
as interim pastor of 12 churches,
following his retirement. Rev.
Lowe and his wife spent five years
ministering with the Cherokee In-
dians in Cherokee and was still
serving his Indian friends until his
death. Rev. Lowe was a two term
moderator of the Hulston Baptist
Association and has also served as
board member of the Baptist State
Convention of North Carolina. He
served as a trustee of the Tennes-
see Baptist Children's Homes,
Inc. and in many capacities with
the Tennessee Baptist Conven-
tion. He was preceded in death by
his wife, Etta Jane Hodge Lowe in
1992; and two sisters, Delilah Eliz-
abeth Carrier and Betty Geneva
Lowe. At the time of his death,
Rev. Lowe was a member of Pine-
crest Baptist Church, Johnson
City, Tenn.

Survivors include several niec-
es, nephews, cousins, and special
friends and caregivers, Pam and
Mildred Cameron and Lucy and
Starlet Maricle, all of Johnson
City.

The family will receive friends
from 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 14,
1999, at the funeral home.
