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Rev. Earl Haynes will join Baptist Children's Home

Rev. Earl Haynes, pastor of the largest village church in North Carolina, will become an associate director of development for the Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina, Dr. W. R. Wagoner, agency president, announced this week.

Haynes, who resigned as pastor of Rolesville Baptist Church recently, joins the agency staff August 27. He will be assigned to work from the agency's development office located in Kinston.

According to W. Isaac Terrell, director of development, said that one facet of Haynes' development responsibilities will be directing the Ten Star Builders Program for eastern North Carolina. The program is a long range ten year campaign to raise \$2½ million capital funds and \$3 million endowment for child care and family services in eastern North Carolina.

Haynes will replace Charles F. Hodges who has become editor of the agency's bi-monthly newspaper, "Charity and Children."

Haynes is a native of Bradenton, Florida. He attended Florida public schools, Stetson University in DeLand, Fla., Howard Payne College in Brown-

wood, Texas, and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II.

The new staff member has previously pastored churches in Palmetto and Osprey, Florida; Lampassas, Texas; and New Sandy Creek Baptist Church in Henderson, N. C. He has also pastored Mars Hill and Union Baptist churches in the West Chowan Association and was at Rolesville for the past seven years.

Haynes is married to the former Jacqueline Boldt of Venice, Fla., and they have three children.

He is a charter member of Rolesville Lions Club, chaplain of Rolesville Volunteer Fire Department and a member of Rolesville Community Development Organization and counselor to families in Wake County Juvenile Court.

Haynes has been on the resolutions committee of the N.C. Baptist State Convention and president of the Wake Forest Ministerial Association. He is a chaplain's associate at Wake County Memorial Hospital. He has served as an adult Bible study teacher and pastor for the children's choir camp held at Camp Caswell this year.
