8-28-1938, P. 256. Brother W. C. Wescott was elected pastor
by a unanimous vote and accepted the call -
starting date 12-18-1938

6-18-1939, P. 260 - Brother Wescott called for another year

6-23-1940 - Book 3, P. 6, present pastor & tended an indefinite
call; If pastor or church want to change they
must give three months notice in advance -
(Brother Wescott died without notice 7-18-1940)
