

Rev. Boyd Accepts Call To Alabama

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The Rev. E. R. Boyd, pastor of the Main Street Baptist Church, for the past five years, has been called to the pastorate of the Wayside Baptist Church in Alexander City, Ala.

He and his wife and their two children will leave Hendersonville for Alexander on November 23.

Prior to coming here Rev. Boyd was pastor of the First Baptist Church in Elizabethtown for two years and four years, prior to that he was pastor of the First Baptist Church in La Grange in Lenoir County.

A 1954 graduate of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky., Rev. Boyd is a native of Washington, N. C.

He grew up in Norfolk, Va., where he attended Maury High School until 1948.

From there he went to the University of Richmond in Richmond, Va., where he finished in 1951.

He is married to the former Miss Marilyn Elizabeth Dennis and they have a son and a daughter.

During his five years in Hendersonville Rev. Boyd was elected as president of the Baptist Pastors' Conference and is presently serving as chairman of the board of directors of the Baptist Laymen's Witnessing Foundation here.

Currently he is also serving on the ministers examining committee for the Carolina Baptist Convention and has recently been preparing the morning radio devotionals for the Henderson County Ministerial Association of which he is also a member.
