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ORDINATION

Pursuant to a call from Bethel Baptist Church, Transylvania county, N. C., a Presbytery was convened July 13th, 1862, consisting of brethren J. King, J. W. Duckworth, J. B. Marsh, and E. Allison, to consider the propriety of ordaining brother S. N. WHITSON, recently from the Southern Theological Seminary to the work of the Gospel ministry. After a satisfactory examination, proceeded to ordination in the following order: prayer and sermon by brother J. B. Marsh; charge by brother J. W. Duckworth; right hand of fellowship by brother King.
