Minister To Assume Duties At Area Church

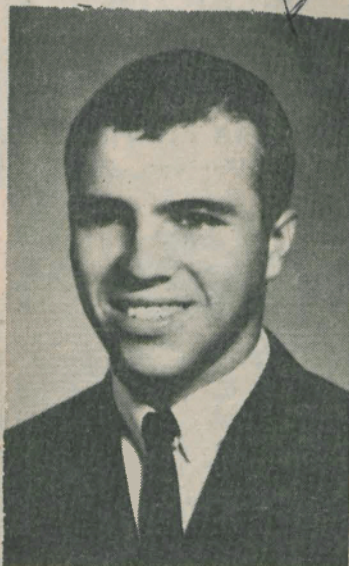
A Haw River church will be served by a regular minister beginning April 27.

I was highly disturbed by the article on

the town of Boonville. It was very evident to me that your reporter did not interview enough people and seemed to take much of her information from those who frequent the Boonville Restaurant, and therefore her facts did not represent those of the town.

I'm sure there are others I have not named, for which I apologize. When I came to Boonville we had only one place to eat, Sam's Dairy Freeze. Now we have Chaps, Mainstreet and Boonville Restaurant.

Last year, in celebration of its 100th anniversary, hundreds of people came home to Boonville to share wonderful, clean fun, food and fellowship. Please get your facts straight before you put down our town.
