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Church Department Appoints Howington

Nolan P. Howington, son of Mr. and Mrs. Z. W. Howington of Rt. 4, Shelby, has been named editorial staff consultant for the Southern Baptist Sunday School Board's church training department.

Howington will join the department in August to serve as an advisor and consultant to board church training personnel on publication content dealing with assigned curriculum areas.

A native of Winder, Ga., he was reared in Shelby, earned the bachelor and master of arts degrees from Wake Forest College and the master and doctor of theology degrees from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville.

Following seminary, he was pastor of Round Hill Baptist Church in Union Mills. Later he served South Knoxville (Tenn.) Baptist Church from 1951-53 and First Baptist Church in Little Rock, Ark, 1953-57. He was called again as pastor for South Knoxville Church in 1967.

Howington was a professor at Carson-Newman College in Jefferson City, Tenn. from 1950-51 and later became professor of ethics at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville from 1957-67.

Dr. Howington has served as pastor of Union Mills Baptist Church, South Knoxville Baptist Church, Knoxville, Tenn.; and First Baptist Church, Little Rock, Ark.

He has been associate professor of Sociology at Carson-Newman College and professor of Christian Ethics at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He currently serves as Curriculum Consultant, Church Training Department, Sunday School Board, Southern Baptist Convention, Nashville, Tenn.

Dr. Howington and his wife, the former Marietta Price of Ellenboro, have three children, Richard, Pat and John David.

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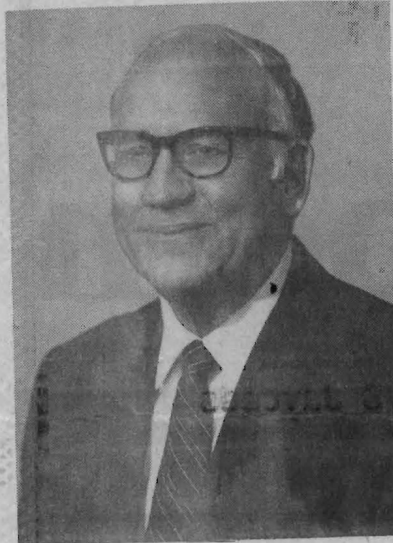

In addition to Dr. Howington's messages, a children's program will be provided, led by Vonda Kay Holland of Rutherfordton.

Former pastor to wrap up celebration at Round Hill

UNION MILLS — Round Hill Baptist Church will conclude its week-long 150th anniversary celebration with a special service Sunday, June 3, beginning at 10:30 a.m. Sunday School will not be held.

Dr. Nolan P. Howington, a pastor at Round Hill in the 1940's, will be guest speaker. A native of Shelby, Dr. Howington is retired from the Southern Baptist Sunday School Board in Nashville, Tennessee, as a consultant on publication content. He and his wife continue to make their home in Nashville.

He has earned degrees from Wake Forest University, the Southern Baptist Seminary, and has done graduate work at the University of Edinburgh, Scotland.

After his pastorate at Round Hill, Dr. Howington was pastor of South Knoxville Baptist Church in Tennessee and the First Baptist Church in Little Rock, Ark. He was also professor at Carson-Newman College and professor of ethics at the Southern Baptist Seminary before moving to the Sunday School Board.

In addition to Dr. Howington's address, the morning worship will
