LENOIR — Rev. Garland Dee Higgins, 60, of Corolla Hills, Lenoir, died Monday evening, May 29, 1995 at Grace Hospital, Morganton, following an illness of two years. Born July 24, 1934 in McDowell County, he is a son of Welzie C. and Ada Riddle Higgins, Nebo. He attended Fruitland Bible Institute. Rev. Higgins served as pastor of several Baptist churches including Catawba Heights, Laurel Hill, Woodlawn, and Grandview in McDowell County; Fairview in Yancey County; Berry's Chapel in Spruce Pine; and twice at Riverside in Morganton. He retired due to his health from Miller Hill Baptist Church in Lenoir on Sept. 30, 1993. Rev. Higgins served as evangelist for many revivals throughout the United States.

Surviving in addition to his parents, are his wife, Marjorie Brooks Higgins of the home; two sons, Garry Higgins of the home and Davy A. Higgins, Marion; one daughter, Mrs. Sheila Reel, Marion; three brothers, Ray Higgins, Grandbury, Texas, James Higgins, Marion and Troy Higgins, Nebo; one sister, Mrs. Joyce Gulledege, Alabama; and three grandchildren.
