Finding a church home, one that you feel comfortable attending, one that offers programs for your whole family is not that easy.

At Second Baptist in Dunn, Rev. Steve Davis knows the importance of finding a good church home and that time is valuable. So he has created a way for folks to learn more about the church before ever stepping foot inside.

Second Baptist, located off Interstate 95 directly behind Western Steer, has become one of the first churches in the area to establish its own domain on the World Wide Web.

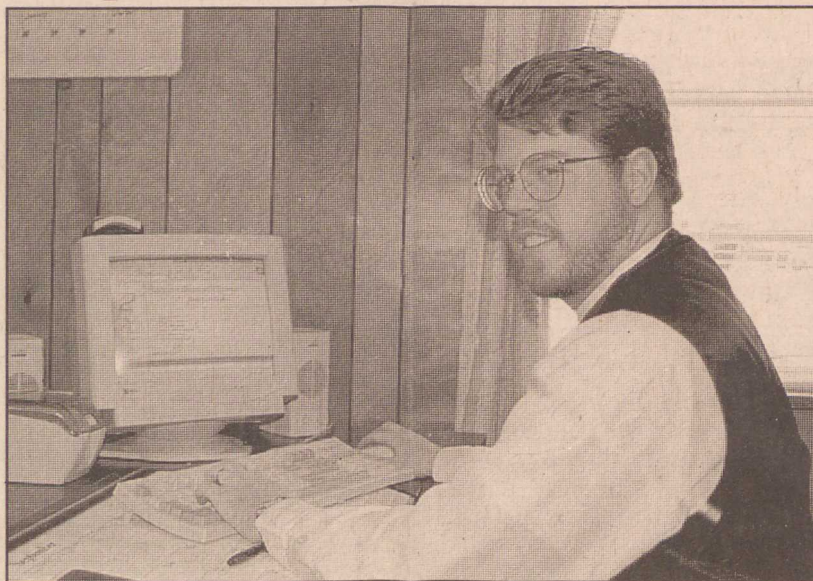
Interested persons can now find out about the church by going to www.dunnsecond.org and can also e-mail the church staff.

The church web page went on-line Dec. 17 after Rev. Davis and members of the church staff conducted an informal study and found the majority of the people unchurched in the area are in the 20-34 age range, the same age group drawn to computers.

Way To Learn About Church

"At Second Baptist we want to reach out to everyone and the World Wide Web was one way to reach a number of people. Some people may not want to come to church until they know more about it. This way they can learn about the church before making a decision to visit and we feel they will like what they find here," Rev. Davis said.

Once you bring up the church page, there are a number of places to visit. You can find out the church's mission, when services and special events are held, where the church is located and how to contact the pas-

tor. You can find out more about each of the programs offered in the church, including the Awana program for the youth, the connection groups, deacon family ministry, music ministry, senior saints for older adults, Sunday school classes, the Women's Missionary Union, youth ministry and also take a look at the church calendar.

Updated Monthly

The page is updated once a month with new information, but Rev. Davis said he hopes to find someone in the church (a webmaster) to keep the site updated more often.

"We realize people come in many shapes and sizes," Rev. Davis said. "We try to tailor our programs to people, not traditions." That is one of the reasons the Web site was created.

If you are looking for a church with a program for your

children look at www.dunnsecond.org. It will tell you all about the Awana program, an exciting way to teach the Bible to children.

Bored with traditional church services? The church Web page will show you that at Second Baptist they strive to be both genuine and relevant in the worship service.

"We offer other programs as we see a need, including in-home Bible studies and support groups," Rev. Davis said.

Links Offer Look At Personality

And if you learn all about the church and still want to know more, Rev. Davis has created some very interesting and fun links to other Web sites, including his own site which tells about his love of sports, holds a collection of his writings and information about his family so you can get to know the pastor

on a more personal level.

"I wanted our page to be both personal and professional and tried to be real human with it," Rev. Davis said. "Soon, I hope to be able to add sermon outlines on the Web and I hope every program in the church will develop its own link. Our goal with this is to bring in the unchurched and give them a home church and we want to reach out to the community."

Rev. Davis said EyeNet Communications of Dunn helped him build the page and his cousin, Glenn Davis, author of The Project Cool - Guide to HTML, also helped with the web page design and offered tips.

Service Times

Second Baptist holds Sunday School at 9:45 a.m. and worship service at 11 a.m. The Awana meeting is Sunday evenings at 6 p.m. Every Wednesday night there are adult, teen and children's Bible study programs beginning at 7 p.m.

To get to the church take Exit 72 from Interstate 95 and turn west on Pope Road. Turn right on Jackson Road at the Chevron. The church is about a quarter mile on the left.

From U.S. 421 turn right onto Sampson Avenue and then turn right on Jackson Road at the new Jameson Inn. The church is on the right.

gram also features special uniforms and awards.

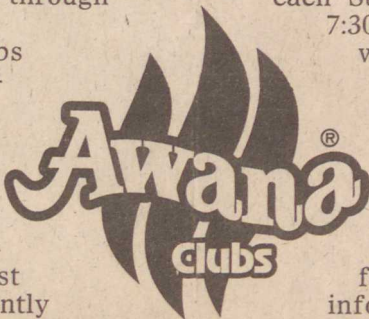
Awana meetings will be held each Sunday from 6 to 7:30 p.m. The church will sponsor an

Second Baptist Members Help Build Church In West Virginia

Over 300 people representing 21 churches were in Sutton, West Virginia last week and the week before helping to put up a church. Nine Dunn residents participating in the church "raising" the final week as part of a program called "Mountain State 200 Missions Project."

The goal of the project was to build 200 churches in West Virginia by the end of 1985. The program began in 1980, and according to Dunn's Second Baptist Church Rev. Bill Denning, about 90 churches and 45 chapels now exist there with the Baptist faith.

The project is a joint effort between the Southern Baptists in N.C. and West Virginia Southern Baptists.

According to Denning, the town of Sutton, where he and eight from his congregation spent the week building the church, doesn't even have a stoplight, but it has faith enough to light up the world.

In a two week period, lawyers, preachers, dentists, retirees, homemakers and others "played carpenters." Out of the 300 people attending the gathering, only six actually had building experience.

The whole week was not spent just hammering, nailing, and painting and other building duties. There were morning Bible clubs, nightly revivals, Senior Citizen Ministry, and then there were those who had to cook the entire time for the many people who had volunteered their services.

According to Denning, about \$30,000 in materials were purchased with funds from the N.C. Southern Baptist Churches who participated in effort to build a church in Sumter. And that was only during the week that the Dunn group was there.

The people from Dunn who attended the church raising were: Rev. Bill Denning and his wife, Jennifer; Jim and Wanza Beasley; Sherrill and Mildred Lee; Charles and Lois Branch; and Gina Whittenton.

Rev. Denning said it was something to attend a service in the church on the final night of its

construction... "About 250 of us packed into the church the night it was finished, and its only supposed to hold 175."

The two-week church, as it could be called, includes a 175 capacity sanctuary, a pastor's study, a kitchen and fellowship hall and several Sunday School classrooms.

The spirit in the whole venture

was personified in the final effort of the league from N.C. when they heard the church was not going to have the money to buy a baptistry.

"We started collecting money among ourselves the Tuesday morning before we were to leave and that night we had raised \$1,200 from nothing...by that Friday some of the group had gone to a nearby town and purchased the baptistry and had it installed by the time the church was finished," Rev. Denning said.

The pastor of Sutton Church, Rev. Herman Hicks, and his congregation were meeting in a 100 year old church on Main Street.

Hicks' church needed a place to grow. The old church needed expensive repairs and there was no room for growth there. Now, with the help of his native state, N.C., and the people like Rev. Bill Denning and the eight others from Dunn, he will have his space...a place in the sun.

Now, talk about a church project. The folks from Dunn's Second Baptist Church can be very proud of themselves and the others who participated in such a worthwhile venture.

Distinguished scholar, and educator will speak at revival services at Baptist Church, Oct. 13. He is Professor John Durham of Southeastern Theological Seminary.

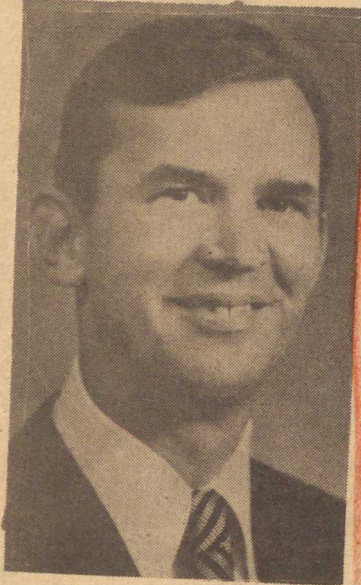

In the literary field as well as in religion, Pro. Durham has published several articles published in well-known references such as the Broadman Bible Commentary.

In 1961, he was appointed as a Distinguished Scholar at the Southeastern Theological Seminary.
