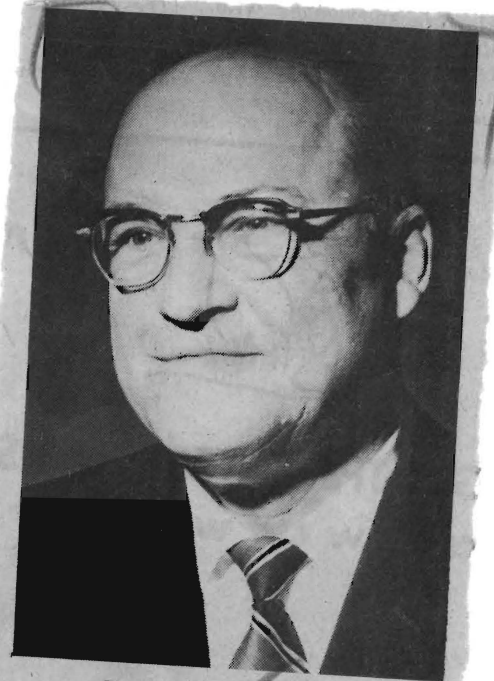
He is an outstanding pulpit speaker and has made an excellent record at the churches he has previously served.

Revival services are scheduled to begin Sunday evening, April 14, at Wendell Baptist Church, the Rev. Baxter Prevatte, minister, announced this week.

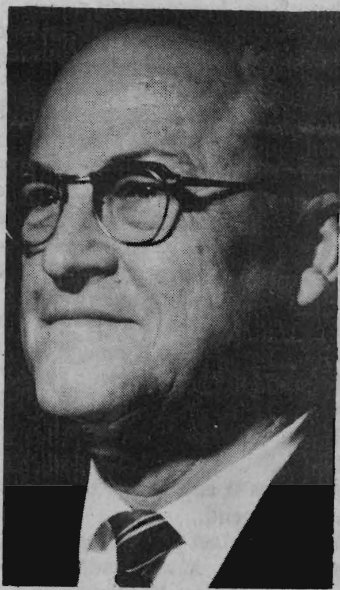
