IN MEMORIAM

Aaron C. Phipps was born in Ash County, North Carolina, October 20, 1910. He was married to Esther Merchant Phipps. He has two sons, four grandchildren and a great-grandson.

In 1943 he was ordained to the gospel ministry at Draper Baptist Church, Draper, North Carolina (now Eden).

He was graduated from Campbell College and received his B.A. degree from Wake Forest College, Wake Forest, North Carolina. Aaron also attended Southwestern Seminary at Fort Worth, Texas and Southeastern Seminary, Wake Forest, North Carolina. During his college days he served churches in Harnett and Granville counties. Before attending Southwestern he served a field of four churches in Alamance and Rockingham counties. His first pastorate after attending Southwestern was the Woodlawn Baptist Church in Danville, Virginia. He was pastor of Mount Moriah Baptist Church, Raleigh association from 1952-1959. During his tenure at Mount Moriah he served his denomination on an associational and state level.

In August of 1959 he moved to Shelby, North Carolina to serve the Buffalo Baptist Church for ten and a half years.

He then became pastor of the Temple Baptist Church, Henrietta, North Carolina. At the conclusion of his tenure at Teemple he retired from the pastorate and moved to Danville, Virginia. He served as interim pastor for many churches in Virginia and North Carolina until his health failed in 1989. On February 3, 1993 God called him to his eternal home.
