John Privott was born August 6, 1926 in Chowan County. After completing high school at Chowan High School in Edenton, North Carolina, he entered the University of North Carolina where he received his A.B. degree. He received his Seminary Training at Southwestern Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas.

Pastorates have included Hamilton, Texas and the Atlantic Church and Smyrna Church in the Atlantic Association.

Rev. Privott served as Sunday School Superintendent and Vice-Moderator of the Atlantic Association.

He served as Director of Missions for the Atlantic Baptist Association from 1958-1960.

Rev. Privott had a very fruitful ministry here in the Atlantic Association; which will be given in detail in the Associational history.

Currently Rev. Privott is serving as Director of Missions of the North Roanoke Baptist Association, where he has served since 1960.

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Rev. Henry Augustus Privette



Henry Augustus Privette was born November 25, 1915 in Union County, North Carolina.

He attended Wake Forest College in 1933. He graduated from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary in 1945, where he received a Diploma in Christian Training.

Rev. Privette married Pauline Horton of Chesterfield County, South Carolina. They have seven children.

Rev. Privette was baptized as a child, but when he was twenty-three, married and the father of three children, he had a dynamic experience with the Lord.

After this experience, he moved his family to New Orleans so he could go back to school. He was ordained in 1943 while he was attending the Seminary and also serving as pastor of a church.

Pastorates included Venice, Alabama; Coffeeville, Alabama; Shelby, North Carolina; and, Southside Baptist Church, Concord, North Carolina, where he served for fifteen years.

In April 1963, Rev. Privette accepted the call to the Atlantic Association to serve as Associational Missionary. His ministry in the Atlantic was long and fruitful. He retired in December 1985.

Mrs. Privette (Polly) has always been active serving beside her husband in whatever capacity needed. Her biggest contribution in the Atlantic Association has been her work with Literacy and Internationals.

The Rev. John Privott, North Roanoke Associational missionary, will hold the fall revival for Rosemary Baptist Church beginning with the 11 o'clock worship service today.

He was born in Chowan County and attended Chowan High School in Edenton, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary at Fort Worth, Texas.

While at the seminary, he served as pastor of Blue Ridge Baptist Church of Hamilton, Texas. As pastor of Atlantic Baptist Church in Atlantic, the Rev. Privott led in the building of a new church, including sanctuary and an educational building.

The minister served as an associational missionary of the Atlantic Baptist Association from 1958-1960. Also has served as superintendent of Missions of the Association since 1960.

Prior to entering the ministry, the Rev. Privott served in the public relations department for Pillsbury Mills in Minneapolis, Minn.

As a member of the Missions Committee, the Rev. Privott serves on the General Board of the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina.

He is married to the former Clara Cameron of Carthage and they have three sons.

Revival services are scheduled at the church each evening through Friday.

Rev. Israel was in the military service before he came as pastor. His wife was a nurse and ministered to the people of the area. When Rev. Israel left this church, he returned to the military, and later he served churches in Louisiana. He retired to California and died in 1979 at 91 years of age.

1943-1953 LUTHER CARL CHANDLER

Rev. Chandler was born in Surry County, North Carolina on May 6, 1908. He was converted at the age of 14 and was ordained at Greensboro, North Carolina in 1933. He attended Mars Hill College and Wake Forest University. He and his family and some friends organized the Rocky Knoll Baptist Church in Greensboro, North Carolina. He was the first pastor there. He left there in 1942 and pastored the First Baptist Church in Randleman, North Carolina. Upon leaving Randleman he came to this area and preached his first sermon in Smyrna Church on the first Sunday in October 1943. During his pastorate, the present church building was constructed. He served Atlantic, Smyrna, and Davis at the same time and had a radio program on a local station for about one year. He left in 1953 and pastored many churches in eastern North Carolina. He was president of the Carteret County Ministerial Association and at one time was second vice president of the State Baptist Convention. He retired in 1967 following a severe illness. He resides in Smyrna and is a member of Smyrna Baptist Church.
