Couple Leads School at Sea Aboard Ship

A Wake Forest graduate and her husband are conducting a "school at sea" this summer for American and Asian students traveling to and from the Orient.

Mrs. Edward J. Neumeier, the former Carol Jean Oldham of Gulf, and Mr. Neumeier are holding shipboard orientation aboard the S. S. President Wilson for passengers traveling to the Orient. They will tour Japan, the Philippines, Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand, Hong Kong, and Macao before returning to San Francisco, Calif. on the S. S. President Cleveland. An orientation program will be held aboard the President Cleveland for Asian passengers en route to the United States. The shipboard program is sponsored by APL in conjunction with the Institute of International Education as a project to better international understanding and exchange. Included in the program are lectures and films on Asian and American history, customs, and cultures as well as instructions in English for Asian students.

Mrs. Neumeier was graduated from Wake Forest College in 1951. She served as a speech instructor and debate coach at Wake Forest during 1953-54 and is now living with her husband in San Francisco. The Neumeiers returned last January from an 18-month trip around the world, including a teaching assignment in Bangkok.
