Overcash Joins Staff At Eastside

Members of the congregation of the Eastside Baptist Church have voted to call Edgar Overcash as administrative assistant at the Eastside Baptist Church and the East-

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side Christian Academy, which will begin operation this fall.

Overcash's area of service will include caring for the financial business of both institutions, complete administration of the Academy, including hiring of staff and acceptance of children in the day care and kindergarten.

In the operation of the church, he will assist the pastor by serving as superintendent of the bus ministry, superintendent of the Sunday School and in the visitation program.

Overcash was born in 1944 in Kannapolis, and he received his public education in the Rowan County Schools. He graduated from Kings Business College with a degree in accounting.
